When she was finally rescued at fourteen, her body looked significantly older. This was the result of being injected with oxytocin daily. These injections are used to induce premature puberty and make children look like adults for the trade.

This is a medical crime and a human rights catastrophe. The girl had spent years in the darkness of GB Road. During the raid, she was hidden in tunnels for hours before the police could find her. The bone test confirmed her true age was only fourteen. However, the tragedy did not end with the rescue. Despite the intervention of the High Court, the girl vanished from a government shelter home. To this day, the MP does not know if she is alive.
